LORAN-C OPERATIONS - This is a proposal to authorize Canadian East Coast Chain (rate 5930) unusable time from 1300Z to 1400Z on **13 Feb 2001**. The purpose of this unusable time is to insert a negative five microsecond chain time step to align chain timing to universal time reference. The adjust will consist of five (5) negative one (-1) microsecond adjustments for a total of negative five (-5) microseconds. The chain will be unusable and blinking during this period. NY – HUDSON RIVER - The Coast Guard is conducting a Waterway Analysis and Management Study (WAMS) of the Hudson River. This study focuses on the area's aids to navigation system, waterborne commerce, marine casualty information, port/harbor resources, and future development projects. Especially critical is determining the need for directional lights in the Hudson River. The Coast Guard currently plans to establish directional lights at Kingston Reach and Duck Cove. However, recently obtained information indicates these aids may no longer be required.
