REPORT DEFECTS IN AIDS TO NAVIGATION TO THE NEAREST COAST GUARD UNIT

I. SPECIAL NOTICES

HI ISLANDS – KAHOOLAWE – ORDNANCE DETONATIONS

Planned ordnance detonations will be conducted around the island of Kahoolawe in an area bound by the following coordinates: 20-22-48.0 N, 156-47-15.0 W, 20-22-48.0 N, 156-46-36.0 W, 20-24-18.0 N, 156-46-36.0 W, 20-24-18.0 N, 156-47-15.0 W. The detonations will be located 7.5 nautical miles southwest of Kahoolawe Island. Detonations will commence between the hours of 6:00AM to 6:00PM on June 26, 2004 through July 3, 2004. In the interest of safety, all vessels are requested to remain clear of the area.

HI ISLANDS – MOLOKAI – REPAIR TO SUBMARINE FIBER OPTIC CABLE

The Cable Ship Wave Venture is conducting repairs on the submarine fiber optic cable from June 13 – 21, 2004 at the following coordinates: 21-02-55.8 N, 157-03-12.6 W. The vessel's length is 141.5 meters, beam 19.4 meters, draft 6.0 meters. VHF CH 16 and 13 will be monitored. The call sign is MZDO7. All mariners are advised to exercise caution and create no wake while transiting this area.

MARIANA ISLANDS - GUAM - APRA INNER HARBOR - DREDGING

Dredging operations are being conducted in the vicinity of Romeo wharf in Inner Apra Harbor from June 02, 2004 until December 31, 2004. The outer limit of dredging will be marked by a red buoy. All mariners are advised to exercise caution and create no wake while transiting this area.

MARIANA ISLANDS - GUAM - OUTER APRA HARBOR

The U.S. Coast Guard Captain of the Port Guam directs all mariners to remain clear of Kilo wharf in Outer Apra Harbor due to DOD explosive loading operations from 2100K on 16 June 2004 to 0800K on 3 July 2004. Vessels are excluded from the area known as Safety Zone B shown on NOAA chart 81054 entitled Apra Harbor, island of Guam, when a vessel berthed at the wharf is displaying a red bravo flag by day or a red light by night. Vessels must keep a 680 yard radius distance from Kilo wharf until the bravo flag is struck or red light is extinguished. Mariners are directed to obey all instructions from Coast Guard personnel that may be patrolling the Safety Zone, who can be reached on VHF-FM channel 16.

The letter **N** preceding the current Local Notice to Mariners number indicates that the affected chart is on Limited Distribution and is normally only for use by U.S. Navy, government-owned or government chartered vessels. Courses and bearings are given in degrees clockwise from 000° T. Bearings of light sectors are toward the light from seaward. The nominal range of lights is expressed in nautical miles.
